● **Strengthening HIV Strategic Information Activities in Central Asian Republics of Kazakhstan, Kyrgyz Republic, Tajikistan, and Uzbekistan under PEPFAR**

ICAP is collaborating with the Ministry of Health (MOH) and National AIDS Centers, laboratories and non-governmental organizations in the Central Asia Republics of Kazakhstan, Kyrgyzstan, Tajikistan, and Uzbekistan to build capacity to collect and use high-quality HIV-related data to inform HIV prevention, care, and treatment program planning. ICAP is developing monitoring and evaluation systems by improving the national population-based surveillance systems, creating an electronic HIV case management system, and implementing data quality assurance procedures. *(funded by PEPFAR through the CDC)*

● **Implementation of Prevention, Care, and Treatment Programs for Individuals with HIV/AIDS in the Central Asia Republics of Kazakhstan, Kyrgyz Republic, and Tajikistan under PEPFAR**

ICAP is partnering with MOHs and National AIDS Centers in Kazakhstan, Kyrgyzstan, and Tajikistan to build national capacity to provide high-quality HIV prevention, care, and treatment services, providing enhanced technical assistance and mentoring to HIV care and treatment facilities, and improving laboratory capacity for quality-assured HIV-related laboratory tests. ICAP also supports HIV prevention for key populations, including medication-assisted treatment, such as methadone for people who inject drugs. *(funded by PEPFAR through the CDC)*
