

• Strengthening Local Capacity to Deliver Sustainable, Quality-Assured, Universal Coverage of Clinical HIV/TB Services
ICAP is partnering with the Ministry of Health (MOH) to provide technical assistance (TA) to scale-up HIV care and treatment by supporting comprehensive, family-focused HIV care and treatment programs to increase access to antiretroviral therapy (ART) for adults and children. This project aims to expand: a strong continuum of care for people living with HIV; the use of data to inform evidence-based programs; and the development of new health systems, policies and tools for use at national and facility level. Recently Completed Projects

Technical Assistance for HIV Prevention, Care, and Treatment (2012 - 2015)

ICAP provided technical assistance to the MOH at the national and state level to strenghten HIV program management and implementation, including standardizing the HIV package of care and using strategic information for evidence-based decision-making. ICAP supported: a nationwide assessment of all ART sites; the development and update of national guidelines, policies, and tools; health care worker trainings in HIV and TB/HIV management; and worked with state health care worker trainings in HIV and TB/HIV management; and worked with state health authorities to support clinical supervision and TA to sites providing ART.
